# CERMANS ATTEMPT TO RECAPTURE BATTLE OF THE SOMME LOST POSITIONS.

STRONG ATTACKS AT THIEPVAL.

## HEAVY NIGHT FIGHTING ON THE ANCRE AND SOMME.

The battle of the Somme is proceeding with brilliant success for Allied arms.

There are two reasons for this. In the first place, the enemy, who expected an offensive by the British alone, supposing the French to have been too much weakened at Verdun to take part in it, had massed important effectives opposite the British.

In the second place, the means of communication enable the enemy easily to bring up reinforcements in the region where the British offensive is taking place.

Accordingly the British have had to withstand very violent German Counter-attacks in the La Boiselle sector, where, after various vicissitudes, they now occupy the entire village.

Heavy fighting continued throughout last night in the neighbour hood of the Ancre and the Somme.

Wo German counter-attacks, accompanied by a heavy bombard ment, on the new British positions at Thiepval were utterly re-pulsed.

A German officer who surrendered to the British with 150 men admitted that by doing so they would be of more use to Germany alive than dead after the war.

The Germans attempted a counter offensive in the north before Ar mentieres, but it was easily checked, causing them heavy losses.

The number of prisoners taken by the British is now more than 5000, making with 8500 taken by the French 13,500.

The French have extended their gains towards the south in the direction of Peronne, from which they are now only five kilometres distant, and where the Germans are hastily organising a bridgehead.

It is probable the operations on the Somme will soon come to a halt to enable the Allies to bring up their artillery and carry out a methodical preparation of the next point to be forced.
